

Course Description

Civics is a standards-based, five credit semester course in which students apply critical thinking skills to investigations of democratic principles of American government, law, politics, individual liberties, and the responsibilities of an "informed citizenry" in the following areas:

These may be checked out on an individual basis. Students assume all responsibility for loss or damage.

Materials:

Students are encouraged to have a folder or binder, pen or pencil, and paper to participate in daily class work. These should be brought to class every day. Each student is responsible for the proper care of textbooks, furniture, chromebooks and the classroom in general.

Grading Policy: The grading scale is as follows:

Individual and group work will be evaluated on the quality of formative and summative assessments:

Formative (40%): (ongoing) assessments which include: warm-ups, class work, notes, individual and group work, and quizzes.

<u>Summative (60%): (mastery)</u> assessments, which include: standard projects, test, final exams, written assessments, and final presentations.

<u>Late/Make Up Work:</u> Students are allowed to turn in work after the due date only with an excused absence or teacher permission. Late and missing assignments can add up very quickly and can severely damage your overall grade. Students who are absent should request the assignments upon return to the class. **Teachers are not required to provide makeup work if the absence is unexcused or a truancy.**



<u>Progress Reports:</u> In addition to the formal mid-term Progress Report (for students earning a C- or lower) and Final Grade Report, students will receive, from the instructor, a detailed printout of assignments, test scores and attendance. Parents may also request weekly grade report forms from the office.

Tardy Policy:

The school tardy policy will be strongly enforced.

<u>I-3 tardies</u> = phone call home, loss of participation points, lunch detention

6th tardy = phone call home, lunch detention

9th tardy = lunch detention, parent conference with administration, possible Saturday school

Progressive Discipline/Consequences:

Students who do not meet these expectations and rules in the classroom will receive:

- I) an additional warning
- 2) referral to school administration and/or removal of device
- 3) referral to school administration, parent conference

Restroom Policy:

Students are given 2 restroom passes during the quarter and must sign out / sign in each time upon using the restroom. Students must attain teacher permission in order to leave the classroom at any time.

<u>Cell Phone Policy:</u> Cell Phones are only allowed in class with teacher permission when used for academic purposes. Cell phones should be Improper usage during permissive time will result in an offense.

- **1) First offense** The electronic device will be confiscated by the teacher and will NOT be returned. The device will be given to the assistant principal to be picked up at the end of the day.
- **2) Second offense** The electronic device will be confiscated from the teacher and will NOT be returned. The device will be given to the assistant principal who will return the device once a parent meeting has been held.
- 3) Third offense Student will lose the electronic device for the remainder of the year.
